 - S. Rauch stated that the winning bid for the 1994 GMC Dump Truck auction on Municibid was \$10,001.00. M. DeStefano confirmed the transaction for payment and to transfer the title to the buyer was scheduled for 15MAR2023. It was agreed that these funds will be held for future Maintenance Dept. Equipment purchase needs.

Letter was reviewed and a motion to authorize the BCT PD to apply for grant funding from Walmart and the Walmart Foundation was made by G. Naus and seconded by M. Sitler. Motion passed 4-0.

CCCD MoU Execution

- Complaint re: Farm Animals on Kachinka Hollow Road Property
 - C. Fisher stated he received a complaint about ducks and chickens in the road by 163 Kachinka Hollow Rd. This will be followed up by either the Zoning Official or Police Dept.
- Comcast Franchise Agreement Follow-up
 - T. Prutzman confirmed that there is a meeting at the Columbia County Commissioners Building on 23MAR2023 to discuss Broadband partnerships, grants, and plans. This meeting is being scheduled by the County Commissioners Office.

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- Regarding the Comcast Draft Franchise Agreement pertaining to Section 11 for the Cure Process, the BoS indicated that this should be consistent across franchises to avoid any potential legal issues, especially as the duration of the franchise agreement and a renewal (if agreed by all parties) is 10 years.
